

AEJMC DIVERSITY ORAL HISTORY INTERVIEW AGREEMENT

AEJMC has been deeply engaged in ensuring diversity in journalism education, and in journalism. For many members, diversity is at the heart of journalism. After the 1969 Kerner Commission Report, news organizations sought to address the lack of racial and ethnic representation in their newsrooms. Organizations such as the ASNE and the RTNDA set lofty goals to achieve parity in newsrooms. Minority and women journalists created their own associations to encourage more from their respective groups to enter journalism, to gain newsroom promotions, and finally, to challenge unfair journalistic treatments. Sexual preference and identification (LGBT) was later recognized as another important aspect of the diversity of journalism.

This oral history project will document the experiences of those who have worked toward a more inclusive news media, more inclusive research and curriculum, more inclusive faculty and student body, and more inclusive service.
